Now through Dec. 30, holiday revelers can hop on the Milwaukee Holiday Lights Festival's <u>Jingle Bus</u> tour presented by Meijer for just \$2 per person to take in the lights and sights throughout downtown.

The 40-minute tour runs Thursdays through Sundays from 6 to 8:20 p.m., starting at the Festival's Warming House located in The Shops of Grand Avenue - 275 W. Wisconsin Ave.

Narrated by a Milwaukee Downtown Public Service Ambassador, Jingle Bus riders learn about key downtown landmarks, places of interest and three decorated Milwaukee County Parks - Cathedral Square Park, Pere Marquette Park and Zeidler Union Square.

Awaiting Jingle Bus riders can enjoy festive melodies from an 18-piece animatronic symphony orchestra of bears, as well as complimentary holiday punch and Happy Dough

Lucky donuts. Children will also receive a holiday coloring book.

Discounted parking is available in The Shops of Grand Avenue's attached structure at a rate of \$3 until 11:59 p.m. with a Jingle Bus validation sticker.



Add a Piece of Milwaukee to Your Christmas Tree with Downtown's Holiday Ornament



Milwaukee Holiday Lights Festival <u>ornament collection</u> are one-of-a-kind keepsakes. Great gifts for family, friends, coworkers and business associates.

For the past 17 years, the festival carefully selects a notable downtown building to feature, and then commissions resident artist Andrew Schuman to hand-carve and cast the chosen landmark in pewter.

This year's ornament features the recently completed Northwestern Mutual Tower and Commons. The \$450 million, 32-story glass structure is one of the first significant 21st century building projects for Milwaukee and has reshaped the city's skyline.

The 2017 Northwestern Mutual Tower and Commons ornament is available for \$19.95 and can be purchased <u>online</u>. Past editions are also available for \$24.95.
