SCULPTURE MILWAUKEE TO OPEN WITH GLAMOROUS FANFARE Sculpture Milwaukee, an outdoor urban sculpture experience, is coming to a Wisconsin Avenue corner near you. Featuring 22 sculptures by 21 artists, the pieces will be positioned along Wisconsin Avenue from 6th Street to O'Donnell Park beginning June 1.

To celebrate this international showcase at our doorstep, Milwaukee Downtown will host a ribbon-cutting ceremony at 12 p.m., Wednesday, May 31 at Chase Tower at Water and Wisconsin, 111 E. Wisconsin Ave. Complete with musical performances and free lunch for the first 750 guests, it will be downtown's first party of the summer and all are welcome to attend.

Sculpture Milwaukee will be on view

through Oct. 22 and feature internationally renowned artists such as Santiago Calatrava, Tony Cragg, Alison Saar, Joel Shapiro and Jessica Stockholder, as well as three Milwaukee-based artists--Michelle Grabner, Paul Druecke and Jason S. Yi. Sculptures will range in size and material, including a 40 ft.-tall stainless steel piece by Saint Clair Cemin and a concrete block sculpture by Sol LeWitt, which will be assembled on-site. ## SHORTER HEADWAYS & SUNDAY SERVICE FOR SUMMER TROLLEYS

Returning for another summer, the Milwaukee Trolley Loop presented by VISIT Milwaukee will connect passengers to downtown's top attractions beginning June 1. Both residents and out-of-town guests can board the "Hop 'n Shop, Wine 'n Dine" route for just \$1 and connect to museums, shops, restaurants and other points of interest.

This year's revised 14-stop route will feature more Wisconsin Avenue highlights, including Sculpture Milwaukee, as well as shorter, 15-minute



headways. Plus, the trolleys will now toll on Sundays. New operating hours for the 2017 service are 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., Thursdays through Sundays, June 1 through Aug. 27.

Ramirez, a visual artist who has created murals across the country for the likes of Microsoft, Warner Music Group, VitaminWater, Red Bull, Stella Artois, and The City of Albuquerque, will concept and execute mural installations on 10 utility boxes from Cass to 9th streets.
