Milwaukee Downtown's Traveling Information Kiosk (TIK) has shifted gears. This summer, information seekers can step inside Milwaukee Downtown's new search engine, which debuted at the end of June.

The MOTOR (Milwaukee's Own Traveling Outdoor Resource) is a tiny house powering ideas on what to do, where to stay and what to eat. It's the first application of its kind, built by Oak Creek, Wis.-based Utopian Villas.

Staffed by Public Service Ambassadors, The MOTOR will be the go-to resource for newcomers and out-of-town guests, providing an interactive, consumer-friendly

experience on all aspects of downtown. The MOTOR will tour the festival and concert circuit throughout downtown Milwaukee and outlying communities. Plus, its new climate-controlled cabin will now make downtown's amenity offerings tangible in winter--or even after dark with its cutting-edge lighting technology.


Ex Fabula: Sculptures & Stories Walking Tours

Milwaukee Art Museum: Public and Private Tours

Narrated trolley tours are offered every Wednesday at 1:30 p.m. until Oct. 18. Tickets for the tour are \$15 for adults and \$5 for kids 12 and under. The price of the tours do not include admission to the Milwaukee Art Museum; however, general Museum admission is available for an additional \$5 at the door.
